

Dear Dr. Magsen:

At the request of your mother in a letter to the Secretary of the Urantia Foundation, I am writing to you concerning the Urantia Book which she has asked to be sent to you.

First, let me congratulate you on entering the field of Psychiatry, a specialty which I regard the most challenging of all medical specialties at this time. I trust you will be a proadguaged American-Myerian psychiatrist. I was a pupil of Freed but I never became a disciple. I could not accept his basic materialism — his mechanistic philosophy.

I thought you might be interested, in connection with the Urantia Book, that it was not a product of automatic writing or any of the techniques of the psychic cults.

I am enclosing an outline of a talk I gave to a cozen or so ministers who recently came here to discuss the origin of the Urantia Book.

I hope, if you are in Chicago in the near future, you will come to see us. In the meantime, I trust you may find the Urantia Book as interesting and challenging as I have found it.
